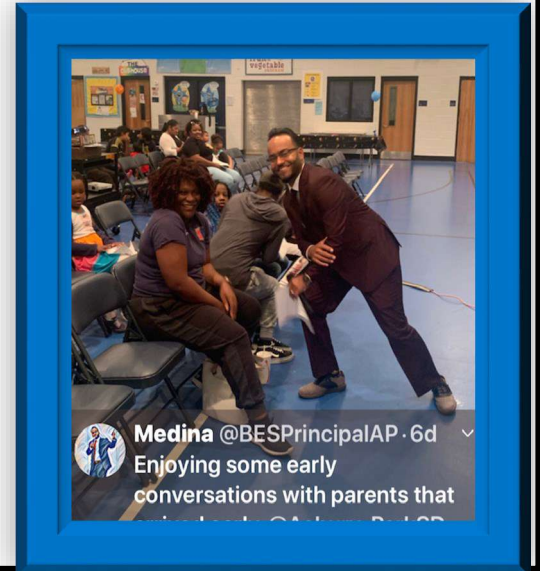

NJ PBSIS at BES A Focus on Good Behavior!

PBSIS, is all about positive reinforcement, and recognizing and rewarding positive behaviors, instead of negative ones. **Positive Behavior and Intervention Support In Schools** program allows students to earn tickets for acting respectable, responsible, and kind to one another in a myriad of settings. The basic message is one of positive reinforcement. If the student makes the right choice, he/she earns a ticket. If the student does not make the right choice, he/she does not earn. PBSIS is a school-wide initiative. Every student has the opportunity to earn from any teacher or staff member, at any time.

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Nurse Dunn Reminders for a Happy Healthy School Year

All forms listed below can be obtained online on the district website

1. **Emergency Card** - All students need to complete this form and return it to school.
2. **Asthma Action Plan** - If your child has a history of asthma, contact Nurse Mary for an Asthma Action Plan. A new form is required yearly.
3. **Food Allergy Action Plan** - If your child has a history of food allergies that require medical intervention, please have your doctor complete this form. A new form is required yearly. Seizure Action Plans are also required to be updated each year.
4. **Medication Administration Form** - All medications administered during school hours require a written permission form signed by a doctor and parent. Medication must be brought into school by an adult with the necessary forms completed. Medication will only be administered by the school nurse. Medication must be in its original, pharmacy labeled container.
5. **PRESCHOOL** students are mandated to have a FLU shot between September 1st and December 31st; please make your appointments now to avoid exclusion from school in January 2020.
6. **Mobile Dentists** - now "Tender Smiles 4 Kids" visit scheduled for 11-20-19. Please watch for consent forms to be sent home. Parental signatures are needed for treatment / screening.
7. **Optical Academy** will visit our school on 10-23-19
8. **VNA Nurse Practitioner Services** --are available on Tuesdays and Thursdays on an emergency basis.

Staff and students were in full Halloween spirit at Bradley Elementary! Parents and the community were present to applaud for the Halloween Parade.

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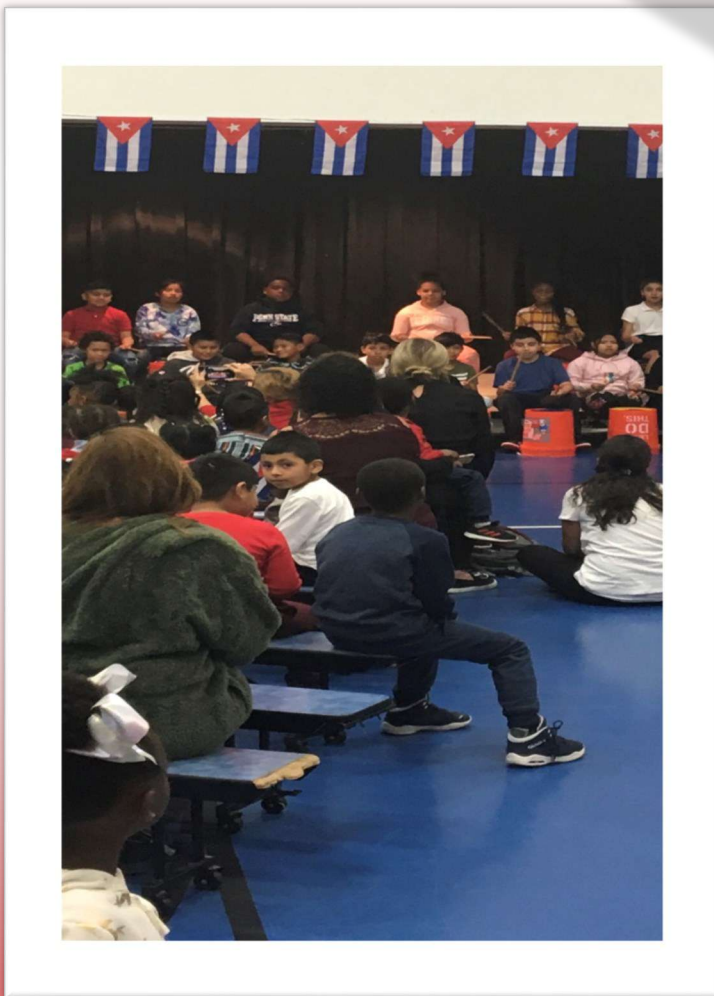


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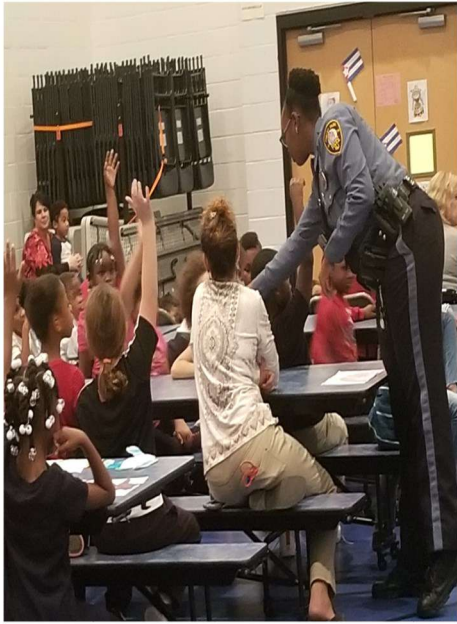

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Miss Suit and Mrs. W's 2nd Grade class has been doing some fun activities in the months of October and November!

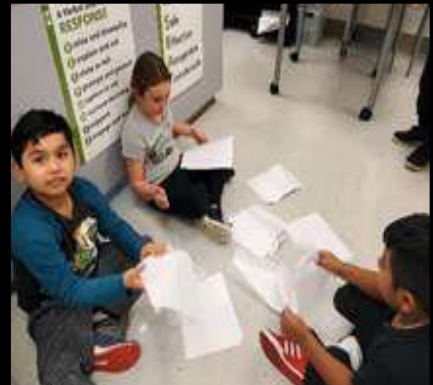
On October 23, our class took a field trip to the Liberty Science Center:

Second graders used texture and their drawing skills to create a texture pumpkin. We reviewed the elements of design, specifically line, shape, form and texture.

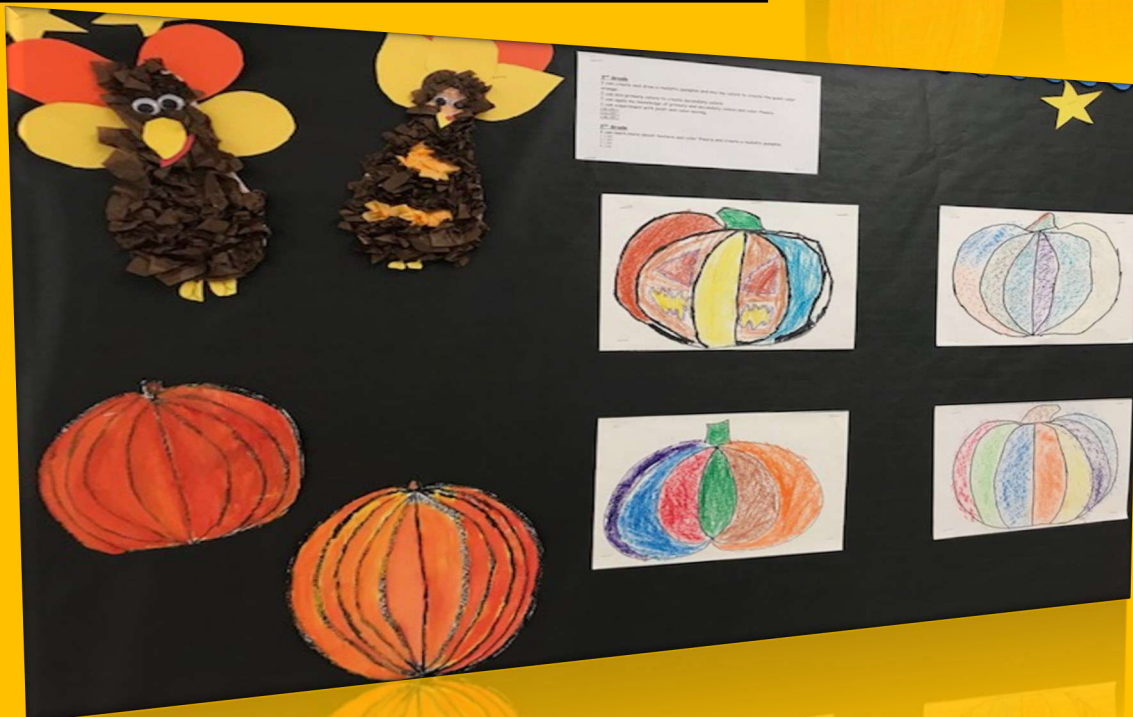
Third graders combined their drawing skills along with their knowledge of primary and secondary colors and color theory and created their own realistic painted pumpkins.

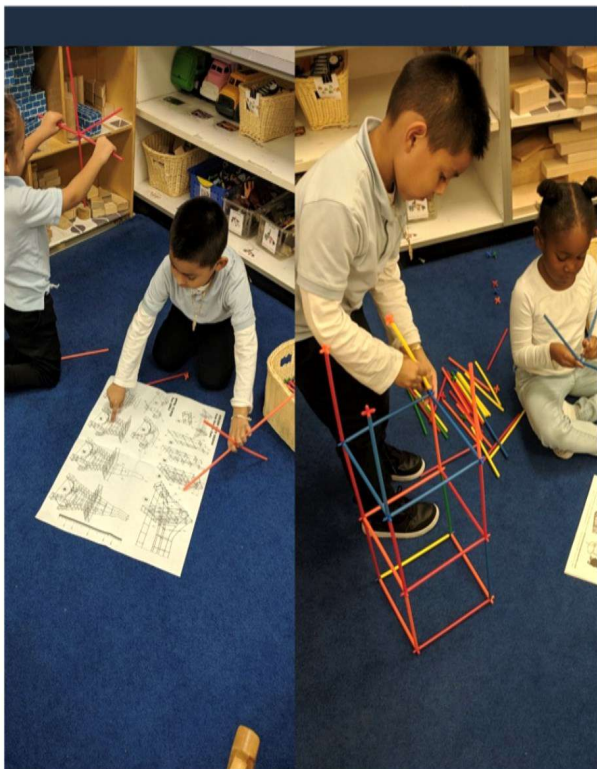
